#### FRANKLIN COUNTY FAIR

There were 44 quilt entries in the fair this year! That is the most we have ever had in the time I've been involved with the fair. Congratulations to Debbie Poole who won best of show!

At the board meeting on Aug 9<sup>th</sup> it was suggested that we add categories for tee shirt quilts and miniature quilts next year. If anyone has any other suggestions let me know. I need to follow up with the exhibit barn supervisor next month.

Mary Ann Burch took notes of the judge's comments and here is a summary of what they look for.

## **Judging Tips**

Techniques are considered Hand, Machine, EPP, FPP, color, texture, quality of fabric, originality. Appreciate imagination, and amount of skill required, color palette.

Corner Technique Stitch down miter, one judge stitches only 1 side herself (the back) Miter neatness, back view.

Borders Measure centers of quilt horizontally and vertically to find border lengths and widths. Wavy borders.

Binding even and fully stuffed. Flange is an even width throughout and stitching stays between flange and binding. Match thread to the binding. Length of stitching.

Quilting Hand or Machine Uniform quilting, enough spacing. Precise quilting. Look for appearance of stitching on back. In hand quilting, should have similar look as top on the underside.

Trim threads, clean off thread, cat hair or dog hair. Try to eliminate thick seam buildup, possibly press open. Press well- before, during and after piecing. They look for buried knots, and general lumpiness.


### **LIBRARY EXHIBIT**



#### Minutes of July 27, 2023 Meeting

#### **Central Kentucky Homemakers Quilt Guild**

For our July meeting we had a "sew date" in the basement of the Extension Office for the purpose of constructing pillow cases for the Children's Sleep Clinic at UK Hospital, starting at 4:00 p.m. Members had been asked to bring their sewing machines. Debbie Ball and Debbie Poole had assembled over 100 kits for the pillowcases. Instructions had been furnished via email in advance of the meeting and can be found by googling "burrito pillow case instructions. Written instructions were provided at the meeting.

There was a break in the sewing at 6:30 p.m. for supper and our business meeting. Kathie Tomazic asked the blessing for our pizza supper, furnished by the Extension Office.

Co-president Debbie Brown brought the business meeting to order at 6:37 p.m. She reminded us of the "Christmas in July" sew dates scheduled for Friday and Saturday, July 28 and 29, for making stockings and items for the Homemakers' Holiday Store. This will include puppets - kitted already for us by Mary Ann Burch and Marilyn Davis. A demo for construction of the puppets is scheduled both days at 10 a.m. Sew days will begin at 8:30 a.m. and continue as late as we care to work on both days. It will be okay to leave sewing equipment overnight. [PLEASE NOTE: This event has been rescheduled for August 18 & 19 due to repaving work that caused cancellation of the 7/28-29 dates.]

Mary Ann Burch informed us that anyone who is going to be an instructor at the Homemakers' Adult Craft Camp to be held in Danville in October is required to get a KSP background check. It is valid for three years, and the Extension Office of the county of the instructor's residence will pay for it. Debbie also told us that the Quilts of Valor awards ceremony on the preceding Sunday had been very nice. Fifteen veterans were honored with presentations of quilts, and QOV received a \$500 gift from one of the honorees.

Carol Wilson reminded us of the upcoming display of quilts that we are putting up at the Paul Sawyier Public Library for the month of August. Anyone who hadn't already brought a quilt for display to Carol can either bring it to Carol's house or else bring it to the library on the day we hang up the display, i.e. Monday, July 31 at 11:30 a.m. [That event was subsequently rescheduled for Tuesday, August 1 at 10:00.] Volunteers are welcome to come to help with hanging the display.

Susan Hampton announced that there is a display of the quilts of Rebekka Siegel, who passed away earlier in the month, at the Owen County Public Library through the end of August.

- Saluted and thanked Mary Quinan for her wonderful job in organizing the quilt competition for the Franklin County Fair earlier this month. The quilt display was particularly nice this year.
- Announced that we can participate in Homemakers' Officer Training on August 23 at the Boyle County Extension Office if we so choose.
- Announced that she will be doing a cooking demonstration at the KY State Fair on Monday, August 21.
- Reminded us of the Heritage Skills Craft Camp October 27 and 28. We are encouraged to participate by taking classes.
- Announced that there will be a serger class on taught by Mary Hixon on Thursday, November 9
  at 10:00 a.m. at the Extension Office. Carla is working on scheduling classes for the rest of the
  year and would welcome class idea suggestions.

Nadine Cox reminded us of the quilting retreat coming up October 11 through 14 at Pieceful Haven in Crestwood. Please let Nadine know if you are interested in attending.

Members with July birthdays were reminded to pick up their birthday fat quarter.

The business meeting concluded at 7:15. 27 people were in attendance. Debbie Ball had brought a plentiful array of door prizes for which she drew winners throughout the evening.
