#### **UPCOMING VOTE ON DUES**

Our bylaws provide at Article III, Section 4 that "Dues shall be reviewed at least every two years by the Executive Board. The Board may recommend changes which shall be ratified by a simple majority of the members present at a guild meeting."

The Board has given thoughtful attention to the issue of our dues over several months, and recommends that annual dues be increased to twenty-five dollars (from twenty dollars). This recommendation was announced and the reasoning for it was discussed in detail at the July meeting. Essentially, we expect to cover our ten-dollar annual dues to the Homemakers (from which we receive substantial benefits) while increasing members' individual dues by only five dollars.

Ratification of the dues proposal will be called for a vote at our August meeting. Payment of dues for the upcoming year, due in September, will be accepted as well.

1 pound fresh summer squash 2 to 3 ears fresh corn 1/4 cup half-and-half 3 tablespoons butter, melted 3 to 4 tablespoons sugar 1 egg, slightly beaten

Cook squash in ¼ cup boiling salted water until tender. Drain; mas squash and place in a saucepan. Remove corn from cobs; stir int squash mixture. Add cream, butter, sugar, and egg; stir well. Cook ovelow heat, stirring constantly, until mixture is thickened. Pour mixtu into a lightly greased casserole. Sprinkle with topping.

#### Cone Flower Row

Block is 12.5" x 12.5" unfinished Row is 60.5" x 12.5" unfinished

#### **Materials:**

- · Purple Fabric FQ or .25 yard
- · Yellow Fabric FQ or .25 yard
- · Green Fabric FQ or .25 yard
- Background .5 yard (4.5 yards for whole quilt)

Cut from Background Fabric:

- A 4 rectangles 12 1/2" x 1 1/2"
- B 8 rectangles 2 1/2" x 3 1/2"
- C 8 squares 2 ½" x 2 ½"
- D 48 squares 1 1/2" x 1 1/2"
- E 16 rectangles 1 1/2" x 6"
- F 5 rectangles 2 1/2" x 12 1/2"

Cut From Yellow Fabric:

- G 4 rectangles 6 1/2" x 2 1/2"
- Cut From Purple Fabrics:
- H 12 squares 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"
- Cut From Green Fabric:
  - I 8 rectangles 6" x 3 1/2"
- J 4 rectangles 1 1/2" x 5 1/2"



- IQ Designer
- 771 Built-In Stitches
- 494 Built-In Embroidery Designs
- Large 11.25" Workspace
- Needle Beam





#### Instructions:

- 1. Add flippy corners, background fabric (D) to Yellow rectangle (G).
  - a.Right sides together, align the square (D) of fabric into the corner of the yellow rectangle (G). Figure 1
  - b. Sew from one corner of the square that sits along the side to the opposite corner. Figure 2
  - c. Trim seam allowance, ¼" from stitching, out towards the corner. Figure 3
  - d.Press. Figure 4
  - e.Repeat for adjacent corner. Figure 5




 Sew 2½" x 3 ½" background rectangle (B) to either side of this unit. Then add background strip (A) along "rounded" edge. Figure 6



- 3. Add flippy background corners (D) to 3 purple rectangles (H) as outlined in step 1. Figure 7 Add one larger flippy corner of background fabric (C) to only 2 of the purple rectangles (H). They should mirror each other. Figure 8
- 4. With all flippy corners in place, sew the three purple rectangles (H) together making sure the smaller corners match. Figure 9










- 5. Add flippy background corners (D) to 2 green rectangles (I) as outlined in step 1. They should be on opposite corners. Your two leaves should mirror each other. Figure 10
- 6. Sew 1½" x 6" background rectangle (E) to top and bottom of each of these units. Figure 11



- 7. Sew 1 ½" x 5 ½" green rectangle (J) between the two units. Figure 12
- 8. Sew the three flower pieces together, yellow coneflower center, purple petals, and green stem and leaves to complete the block. Figure 13
- 9. Make 4 and sew together with 2 ½" x 12 ½" rectangle (F) sashings before, after, and between each block to complete your row.

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Meeting Minutes July 23, 2024 Central Kentucky Homemakers Quilt Guild

Before the meeting was called to order – Debbie Brown gave a demonstration on Laundry tips for quilters based on a book called LAUNDRY LOVE by Patric Richardson with/Karin B. Miller, published in 2021. She also distributed a handout with tips from the book.

MEETING

The meeting was called to order by President Kathie Tomazic at 6:30 pm. Kathie thanked Debbie for the demonstration and the handout.

Member of the Month

Betty Acker was highlighted as the July Member of the Month. Betty started quilting around 2002, but as her story goes, she belonged to art quilt groups. Her artistic talent was certainly displayed as she shared her beautiful artwork. One of her pieces was displayed at KSU in Jackson Hall. She had another piece which was titled "No Name," which she made in 2006. She shared a book that she made which captured the seasons and the elements of The Earth, Wind, Fire, and Water. She was trendy also in 2005 in making her Granddaughter a quilted sweatshirt jacket that she still has today. She shared her art challenges which included the ugly fabric challenge which included feathers about birds. There was a "Hotsie Totsie," challenge which was a free-form embroidery design. She had an Angel Embroidered "Man on the Moon," Trapunto – a method called "stuffed technique." Betty had other items that included the KHQS Challenge that was entitled "Bee a Tree" with raw edge and hot fixed crystals from the Crave Box Quilting Challenge. She ended her presentation by giving a demonstration of rice bags that she made. Thank you Betty for sharing your creative talents with the guild.

**Treasurer Report** 

Nadine Cox reported that we have a budget of \$3700.00 cash available. The big purchases include a microphone and a visualizer projector. She purchased new locks for our cabinets downstairs. She plans to get a label maker to organize items on the shelves. Mentioned getting a display for quilts for the fair possibly an easel.

The yard sale made \$223.50.

There is \$4,230.00 in the Investment Fund for the stocking money.

The Quilt Guild membership fees will increase to \$25.00. It will be voted on at the August meeting. Volunteer Hours were discussed and passed out to be turned in.

Old Business

Sarah Wilding and Sherry Wade discussed the Yard sale. The feedback was great. Everyone seemed to enjoy it, cleaned out their fabric and sewing notions stash, and made some money too. Would like to do it next year – maybe in the Fall on a Friday.

The Brown Bag Challenge will be due in September.

Mary Quinan spoke about the fair and then all of the participants shared their entries and their placings. The entrants were Debbie Poole, Katie Daugherty, Debbie Brown, Nadine Cox, Deb Miller, and Mary Quinan. Congratulations to all of you. Debbie Poole won the Best to Show Ribbon.
