CHARITY QUILTS

A message from Rosemary, the KY state coordinator for Quilts for Kids.

Hello, friends. I'm super excited to share news about our final deliveries of 2023. On Wednesday we delivered to Kentucky Children's Hospital: **99 quilts, 36 NICU sheets, 50 pillowcases, and 3 flannel receiving blankets**. Today we took **27 quilts and 4 fleece blankets** to GreenHouse 17 (the domestic violence shelter). Next week we will take **24 small blankets** (flannel, crocheted, etc.) to the New Beginnings pregnancy center in Winchester. There are actually more sheets and pillowcases here to jumpstart our next delivery, which will probably be in March.

The generosity of your hearts and all your work are overwhelming!!! Everyone has been so appreciative to receive these gifts. I know the children and women will feel the same when they can wrap up in these comforting quilts and blankets. You are blessings to so many!

I hope you enjoy lovely, warm and peaceful holidays with family and friends.


Stockings for Meals on Wheels Recipients Filled and delivered on November 28, 2023

Meeting Minutes November 29, 2023 Central Kentucky Homemakers Quilt Guild

President Kathie Tomazic called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and announced the October minutes had been approved via email. She reminded any members with November birthdays to get a fat quarter.

Treasurer Nadine Cox provided a treasurer's report, indicating a balance of 4,333.92 as of November 28, 2023. The investment account currently has a balance of 4,089.52.

Committee Updates and Reports

Newsletter Chair Mary Quinan reminded members that newsletter information should be submitted to her by December 9 since the December meeting will be early due to the holidays.

Membership Chair Deb Miller welcomed new member Maggie Kennedy to the guild and provided her with a new member gift basket. Deb reported that the guild currently has 54 members. She also announced that instead of printing new member directories each time a new member joins, an addendum will be printed for members to add to the current directory. This will save a lot of paper and ink!

Community Outreach and Other Activities

Leah Tupts reported that the Homemakers Christmas Store was very successful, raising slightly over 800.00. Homemakers dues will again be paid from this amount for CKHQG members. Leah thanked everyone for their help in making the event successful.

Sherry Wade shared that the November QOV Ceremony was well-attended and a great success. She shared a note from a QOV quilt recipient and said that she had received a lot of positive feedback from other attendees and recipients. She thanked everyone who assisted with the ceremony and other QOV tasks.

Debbie Brown updated the guild on the holiday stockings project for Meals on Wheels recipients. Several volunteers helped sort and organize donations, and fill and deliver stockings. Donated items that were more appropriate for youth were given to the Family Resource and Youth Services Center (FRYSC) at Elkhorn Middle School and perishable items were donated to YES Arts. Gift cards were also given to the Meals on Wheels drivers. Debbie shared that the Meals on Wheels coordinator was very appreciative and said that many food recipients had been asking when the stockings would be delivered, as this was something they looked very forward to each year. Debbie also thanked all the volunteers who assisted with the holiday stocking project.

Holiday themed projects that were displayed during the downtown Frankfort Candlelight Event were returned by Carol Wilson. She thanked everyone who volunteered with this event.

The November program featured an extremely informative Tips and Tricks Round Robin walk-through. Vice President Katie Daugherty began the program by introducing the volunteers who would be sharing their knowledge with the group and then had participants "number off" so that groups could rotate through each station. Groups then spent about 8-10 minutes at each station to observe the demonstration with opportunities to ask questions. The stations included wonderful demonstrations on improv/crumb quilting, precision cutting, finishing and binding techniques and matching prints on quilt backs. Thank you so much to Anne Cockley, Susan Dudley, Nadine Cox, Mary Ann Burch and Katie Daughtery for sharing your expertise with the guild!

Crave Boxes were collected and redistributed by Kay Wilson and Susan Hampton and several projects were shared during Show and Tell.

Vice President Katie Daugherty shared some activities she is working on for future meetings. Upcoming meetings will include the December brown bag exchange and Christmas get-together, a January program featuring KHQS Challenge Quilts with a WIP walk (works-in-progress) prior to the meeting and program, and a February "Share the Love" event. She also reported that the brown bag exchange will return to September, so the initial fat quarter exchange will occur in February for those interested in participating. More specific information regarding the brown bag exchange will be shared at a later date. Katie asked for volunteers to bring light snacks to the December meeting and Kathie suggested that people bring a few food items from home that were already prepared in the event that they were busy with other holiday obligations.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:55 p.m.
