# <u>Minutes of December 13, 2022 Meeting</u> Central Kentucky Homemakers Quilt Guild

At 6:20, President Mary Ann Burch Invited all to begin enjoying the festive food and cocoa provided by Social Chair Sarah Wilding. Sarah asked all in attendance to complete a card stating a little-known fact about themselves. At 6:30 Mary Ann called the meeting to order and welcomed one visitor. Members with December birthdays were reminded to choose a birthday fat guarter.

Reports:

<u>Treasury</u> – Debi Newman reported a bank balance of \$8,028.00, composed of \$4,621.26 designated for stockings, and \$3,406.74 belonging outright to the guild. It also was reported that we had raised \$565 at the Homemaker's Children's Holiday Store and had paid our Homemaker dues of \$490 from the proceeds.

<u>Membership</u> – Debra Miller reported that we now have 51 members. Our membership directories have been completed and were distributed to attendees at the meeting. Debra expects to have new name badges for us at the January meeting. The new member welcome information and baskets will also be finalized by January's meeting. We had 31 members present.

<u>Newsletter</u> – Mary Quinan will need items for the January Newsletter by January 15.

<u>Quilts of Valor</u> – Sherry Wade and Debbie Brown reported. Debbie Brown and Mary Ann Burch also brought copies for us of the December <u>Frank</u> Magazine featuring QOV on the cover. Sherry Wade has received a couple of nice gifts in support of QOV as a result of the good publicity. There is a single quilt presentation scheduled for a veteran (Raymond Azbill, Theresa Barton's dad) on December 14. That will bring the total of quilts awarded to 25.

The next QOV meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 10 at 9:00 at the Extension Office basement with a presentation on how to make a Disappearing Pinwheel Block beginning at 10:00. We have the room until 4:00 p.m. so that we can work on either our own QOV projects, or make disappearing pinwheel blocks. All are welcome.

<u>Charity Quilts</u> – Debbie Poole reported that in the past year the guild had donated 42 quilts to Quilts for Kids, 5 Hospice quilts, and 200 Christmas stockings in addition to the aforementioned 25 QOV quilts.

Hospice Quilts – Sheri Mestan Bochantin reported that lap size is good for Hospice Quilts.

<u>Christmas stockings</u> – Debbie Brown mentioned the nice publicity we had received as a result of this project.

<u>Library</u> – Anne Cockley reported that she and Nadine Cox have gone through the books donated by Marie Hagg and put the most current ones on the library cart and will donate the rest. Anne is working on assembling an updated list of the volumes in our library.

<u>Social chairman</u> - Sarah Wilding conducted our program by reading the cards of little-known facts and having the attendees figure out who was being spoken of, then having that person present her brown bag challenge project. We learned some interesting facts about one another and saw some delightful brown bag projects!

<u>Children's' Holiday Store</u> – Leah Tupts reported on the items which sold best. Total proceeds were \$565.

<u>Upcoming programs/workshop</u> – VP Sherry Wade reported that in January Nadine Cox will show the KHQS challenge quilts. In addition Nadine will launch the latest Cabinet Challenge at our January meeting.

Sherry is in the midst of arranging for Sarah Frye to conduct a workshop for us on Saturday, April 29, 2023 from 10 to 4 p.m. Specifics on the subject matter for the workshop are forthcoming.

We had a lively Show and Tell. Door prizes were awarded. The meeting was dismissed at 7:45 p.m.

Hello! I'm happy to report on our final deliveries for 2022 today:

To GreenHouse 17: 19 quilts, 6 fleece blankets To Kentucky Children's Hospital: 58 quilts, 19 NICU sheets, 10 fidget dolls, and 1 pillowcase

With this delivery we passed the 3,500 milestone; beginning with our first batch of 17 quilts in 2011, our QFK chapter has now distributed 3,530 quilts as well as thousands of other items such as sheets, pillowcases, dolls, superhero capes, and much more. You have touched so many lives with your skills, hard work, and loving hearts. Thank you!


