






## **REMINDER**

Kathie announced that the next CKHQG board meeting will be held January 17, 2024 at 9:00 am at the Extension Office and reminded everyone that they are welcome to attend. She also encouraged anyone with questions or concerns to feel free to contact her. The January meeting will be on Tuesday, January 23 at 6:30 p.m. at the Extension Office.

Information regarding a Quilt Show at the Kentucky Music Hall of Fame was shared with the group. This event will be held in Renfro Valley, Kentucky on February 17, 2024, from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Quilters can enter one-two quilts. Kathie has applications for those who are interested. Please contact Mary Quinan if you are interested in coordinating transportation to the event.

The majority of the meeting was spent revealing and sharing projects from the Brown Bag Exchange. Members shared several delicious appetizers along with many beautiful items that were exchanged and greatly appreciated by all!

Crave Boxes were collected and redistributed by Kay Wilson and Susan Hampton and several projects were shared during Show and Tell.

Vice President Katie Daugherty reported that the January meeting will feature KHQS Challenge Quilts with a WIP walk (works-in-progress) prior to the meeting and program. In February, everyone is encouraged to bring a "stuck" project so that others might share suggestions on how to move forward. The 2024 brown bag exchange distribution will also occur in February so that the exchange can be held in September for the Guild birthday party. Finally, the March meeting highlight will be the crave box reveal!

The meeting was adjourned at 7:35 p.m.
