Meeting Minutes October 24, 2023 Central Kentucky Homemakers Quilt Guild

President Kathie Tomazic called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and the minutes of the September meeting were approved.

Treasurer Nadine Cox provided a treasurer's report, indicating a balance of 3851.60 as of October 23, 2023. The Christmas stocking fund currently has a balance of approximately 4,089.00.

Vice President Katie Daugherty reported that she is working on a schedule for upcoming program ideas and welcomed suggestions and feedback regarding the needs and interests of the guild membership. Katie announced that the November program will be a Round Robin of tips and tricks where participants will learn four new things in 30 minutes

A Quilt Registry event with Vickie Coleman is being planned for 2024 with dates and times to be determined. Volunteers will be needed to assist throughout the event. More information regarding this will be coming soon!

Membership Chair, Deb Miller. welcomed new member Susan Dudley to the guild and provided her with a new member gift basket. Deb reported that as of October 24, 2023, the CKHQG has 49 members.

Sherry Wade shared that the guild yard sale will be scheduled for Spring 2024 and is currently working with a committee on logistics. Due to a lack of storage space, no items should be brought to guild meetings but participants are encouraged to begin setting items aside that can be donated at home until final arrangements for storage are made. Sherry also shared that the next Quilts of Valor presentation will be held at the VFW on November 12, 2023, at 2:00 p.m., with 25 veterans being recognized, including a veteran who is 100 years old! The next QOV sew date will be Tuesday, November 14 at the Extension Office.

Carol Wilson collected several items for the Candlelight Tour quilt display. The quilts will be displayed in the Frankfort Dance Studio window from November 9 -11.

Sheri Mastin Bochantin reported that she delivered quilts to the local Hospice chapter and that they were extremely grateful. They will accept quilts of all sizes. It was suggested that the guild consider designing a label for future Hospice quilts so that families will know the origin of the quilt.

Debbie Brown provided an update on the holiday stockings project for Meals on Wheels recipients. A "sew-in" was held prior to the meeting for the construction of stockings. Kay Wilson shared a new pattern and several kits were made available for participants to complete during the sew-in and to take home for later construction. Currently, WesBanco and four local

churches are collecting items to fill the stockings and more information about filling and distributing the stockings will be provided at a later date. A photographer from *Frank Magazine* took a group picture that will be included in an article about the Meals on Wheels project in the December edition.

Leah Tupts reported that there is a large inventory of items for the Homemaker's Holiday Store. The Holiday Store will be "open" on November 18 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Volunteers are needed from 8:00 a.m. to around 1:00 p.m. for various jobs and Leah will send out an email to members for volunteer opportunities. Gift bags and tissue paper are also needed. Additionally, please call Mary Ann Burch with any questions regarding puppets.

Crave Boxes were collected and redistributed by Kay Wilson and Susan Hampton.

President Kathie Tomazic opened a discussion regarding current storage needs for the guild. Due to donations and other projects, the amount of fabric and quilting materials has outgrown the available storage space in the closets reserved for the CKHQG. Some materials are housed in the Extension Office garage and are not always easily accessible. Many members have generously given their time to organizing fabric and materials, but the lack of storage space is still an issue as donations and outreach opportunities continue to accumulate. Kathie suggested that a "map" be developed that will include the location of guild fabric and materials so that these items can be easier to locate and put to good use. A suggestion was also made that members could come early to meetings to "shop" the fabric that is currently being stored at the Extension Office. Potential solutions will continue to be explored and considered!

Several projects were shared during Show and Tell.

Following the business meeting, Nadine Cox provided a presentation highlighting her recent experience at the Quilts of Valor convention in Paducah. Nadine showed several interesting gadgets that were distributed at the convention. She was able to meet other QOV members from other states and gathered new ideas from these groups. She shared a new resource book that includes QOV quilt patterns made exclusively of half-square triangles and proposed that the guild start a collection box for HSTs for future QOV.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
