### **UPCOMING CLASSES**

<u>Workshops - Upcoming and recently concluded</u> From Katie Daugherty

I have spoken to Joyce York about the upcoming <u>Metro Rings</u> class scheduled for Saturday, October 19. Joyce expects that "all systems are go" for the class to proceed as scheduled. There are 19 participants enrolled. The class starts at 9:00 a.m. The (basement) classroom will be open at around 8:00 a.m if you want to come early to settle in and have a cup of coffee. Lunch is provided as part of the cost of registration.

Regarding the <u>One Block Wonder</u> class on September 28, it was a big success! Many thanks to Marcella Wright, who taught the class, and her helper, Lula Raye. There were 17 students of various skill levels, and <u>everyone</u> was able to prepare and cut their stacked fabric and start sewing their triangles into kaleidoscopic hexagons by the end of the day. After we see how we are coming along with making our hexagon blocks, Marcella has offered to lead another class session to help with the layout of the blocks into a quilt.



## **CHARITY QUILTS**

Happy Fall, ya'll! Hope everyone stays dry and safe over the coming days.

I'm happy to report two deliveries for the month of September. Earlier this month we dropped off 3 quilts for the upcoming Habitat for Humanity home dedication in Berea. Today we made the following delivery to Kentucky Children's Hospital in Lexington: 76 quilts, 111 pillowcases (96 of them for Halloween), 20 NICU sheets, 7 flannel baby blankets, and 33 Beads of Courage bags. Abby and Corinne at the hospital were so happy to receive them and are probably right now in the process of divvying them up for the different departments.

As usual, I asked if there were any special requests from the hospital staff for us. Abby said that the nurses love our quilts and definitely want us to continue making them as we have been, but they were also wondering if we could incorporate softer fabrics such as fleece or flannel into some, perhaps as backings. They get a number of children with sensory issues, and the extra softness would comfort them even more. I mentioned that we used to make some crochet-edged fleece blankets, and she said those would be great, too. So, friends, we have something to add to our repertoire!

As always, thank you for your hard work and all the love and prayers you pour into the things you make for the children. It certainly makes a difference!!!



The tv host and author of <u>Laundry Love</u>: <u>Finding Joy in a Common Chore</u> will join us direct from his laundry room for an engaging one-time event for the next session of Big Blue Book Club. On November 7, 2024 at 7:00 pm eastern time, Patric will return to his Old Kentucky home via Zoom to answer all your laundry questions, just as he does in his Mall of America store in Minnesota or on "The Laundry Guy" tv show. ## Meeting Minutes September 24, 2024 Central Kentucky Homemakers Quilt Guild

President Kathie Tomazic called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and introduced September CKHQG *Member of the Month,* Sarah Wilding. Sarah shared that she has been sewing and quilting for over 50 years, beginning with embroidery when she was a child. She gives most of her quilts to others but likes to make table runners for use in her home, most of which are reversible. She machine quilts most of her work and showed a project that she had straight-line quilted, saying that using a subtle quilt design helps highlight the design. Sarah shared several projects she had made from different classes and retreats, all of which were beautiful examples of her talent and experience.

### **Committee Updates and Reports**

Ashley Nguyen was welcomed as a new member and was given a new-member gift bag. Deb Miller reminded everyone that CKHQG dues were due and that a new directory would be coming soon.

Debi Newman reported that a beginning quilters class is in the works, but the dates have yet to be determined.

### **Community Outreach and Other Activities**

Debbie Brown shared that 126 Christmas stockings are finished, with 40 still needed. She asked that if any were still being completed to please bring these to Friday stitchers. She also announced that a room at the Extension Office has been reserved for a stocking making class on Sunday, October 20, from 1:00 – 5:00 p.m. This event will be open to the public with a step-by-step demonstration on how to construct a lined stocking.

Sherry Wade announced that things are in good shape regarding the two QOV Award Ceremonies in November. There will be a QOV sew day on October 8 at the Extension Office. Mary Quinan will send an email regarding a date and time for QOV photography. The next QOV business meeting will be October 15 at 5:30 p.m. at the Extension Office.

Carol Wilson shared that quilts for the downtown Frankfort Candlelight Tour will be displayed November 7 – 10. She asked that quilts for display be brought to the October guild meeting and encouraged members to finish up holiday projects and bring them in for the display.

Leah Tupts reminded anyone who is interested in donating to the Homemaker's Holiday Store to keep making items. There is still a need for items for men. Items will be priced from \$1 - \$5.

### **New Business**

The One Block Wonder class will be Saturday, September 28 at the Extension Office, facilitated by Marcella Wright. She is glad to facilitate a second day, if needed, to assist participants with laying out the blocks and completing their quilts.

Information regarding the <u>Ft. Harrod Heritage Craft Camp</u> (October 25-26, 2024) was shared by Kathie and brochures were available for further information. Kathie also announced that "Quilting Math" booklets were available for members. These were compiled by Mary Ann Burch and printed and bound by Carla Carter.

Guild officers were elected when the slate was approved by acclamation. Deb Miller conducted the swearing in of officers who were present: Kathie Tomazic, president; Katie Daugherty, vice-president; and Kris Jarboe, secretary. Treasurer Nadine Cox was absent due to illness.

### **Program**

Tonight's meeting celebrated the CKHQG's 32<sup>nd</sup> birthday. Members with milestone memberships of 5, 10, 20 and 25 years were recognized, and each was given a seam ripper to commemorate the occasion.
